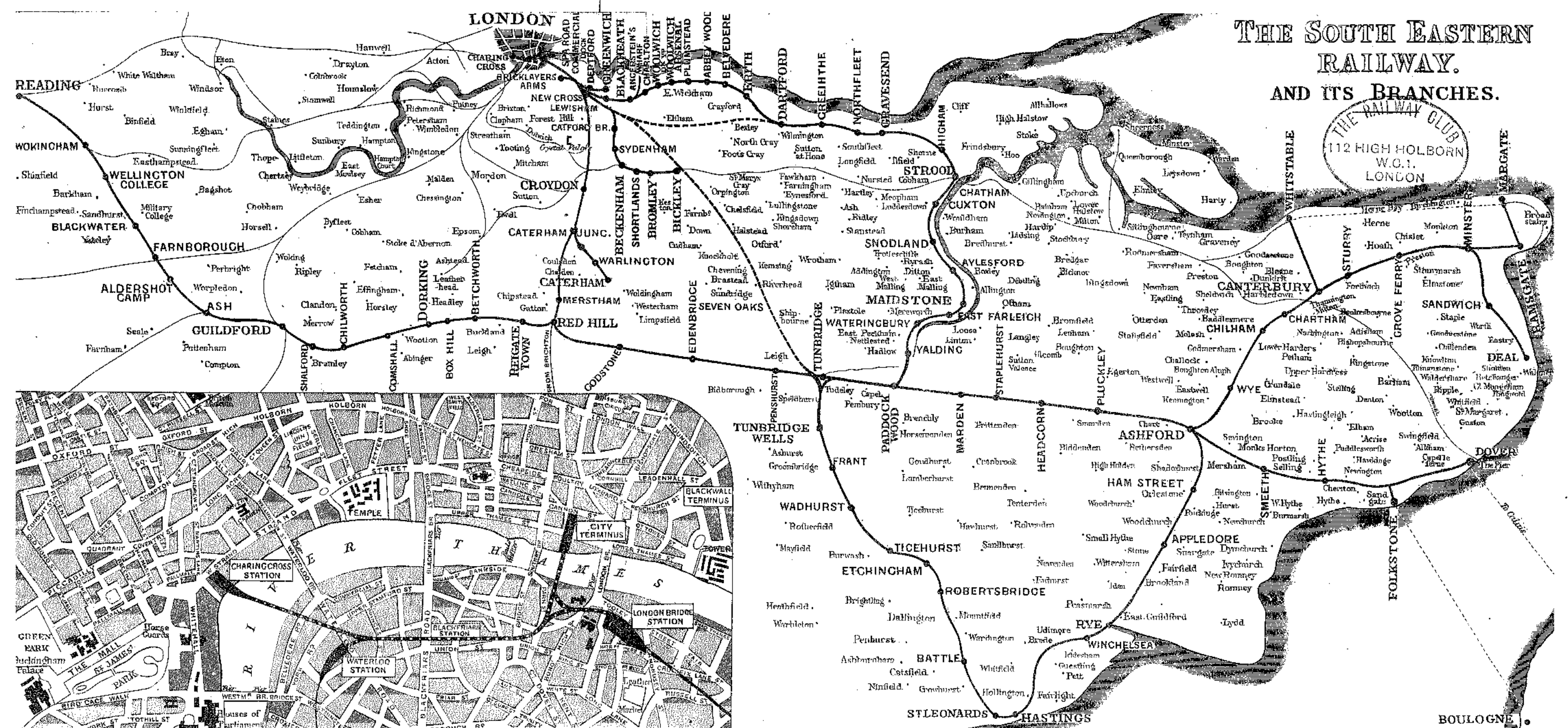

GENERAL INFORMATION—continued.

Boulogne Station is at Capécure, a short distance from the Harbour. Omnibuses convey Passengers from the Custom House to the Station, where Refreshments can be obtained.

A Carriage for the exclusive use of Ladies is reserved both on the South-Eastern and Northern of France Railways.

Invalid Carriages.—On the Lyons Railway there are "Coupe lits" for sick travellers. There is no carriage specially adapted for Invalids on the Northern Line, and the Ordinary Carriage has places for 8 passengers.

BELGIUM AND FRANCE.

Passengers should be at the Station ten minutes before the time of starting, and be provided with the exact amount of their fare, to avoid the delay caused by receiving change.

Smoking is expressly forbidden in 1st and 2nd class carriages; in most Trains there are smoking carriages.

Luggage must be taken to the station a quarter of an hour before the time of starting. It can be insured by payment of an additional sum of ten centimes on 100 francs worth. Travellers are requested to remove all old addresses, and have their own very legibly written. They may not take any luggage into the carriages, weighing more than 50 lbs., and only such as can be placed under the seats without inconvenience.

Customs.—Notwithstanding the above regulations, all trunks or parcels which have to pass a frontier must be given up at starting, and are conveyed in the "Customs" truck. This regulation applies even to hat boxes and necessities. Any luggage kept express goods.

Some French Goods.—as New Clothes, Millinery, Printed or Dyed Cotton, Woollen and Linen Fabrics, Silk, &c.—are charged at a reduced rate of duty on entering Belgium. But to obtain this reduction, it is necessary to have a certificate, termed "certificat d'origine," from the French Customs, and to present this with the goods at the Belgian Customs. On this system, Silk, for instance, pays 4 francs, instead of 10, for each kilogramme. Travellers can obtain the necessary paper at the *Bureau de la Douane*, at Paris.

Through Tickets are delivered at the Brussels (north), Antwerp, and Ostend stations, for Berlin, Leipzig, Dresden, and Hamburg. These tickets are available for a month, and allow the traveller to stop at the principal towns in Belgium & Germany. At the Cologne Railway Station, Travellers proceeding North may obtain Tickets, and have their luggage booked for Düsseldorf, Minden, Bremen, Hanover, Lüneburg, Hamburg, Brunswick, Magdeburg, Potsdam, Berlin, Halle, Leipzig, Dresden, &c.; and travellers arriving from these places, and proceeding to Belgium, France, or England, can obtain tickets, and have their luggage booked at the Deutz Station, Cologne. Special Omnibuses attend both Stations.

No Second Class Tickets are issued by the 8.30 p.m. (Night Mail), which is only First Class from London to Dover; but Second Class Passengers proceed to Dover by the 6.30 p.m. Train, and travel by that class where there are Second Class Trains on other Lines. Where, in any case, the Travellers take Second Class throughout, holders of Second Class Tickets must pay the difference of Fare. Through Second Class Tickets are available by Mail or Express Trains, on paying the additional sum, of 7s. 4d. to Dover, and 7s. to Folkestone.

PASSPORTS.

FOREIGN OFFICE, April 21st. 1858.

Notice is hereby given, that in order to facilitate still further the obtaining of passports by British subjects desiring to proceed to the Continent, passports will henceforth be issued to any British subject who shall produce or send to the Passport Department of the Foreign Office, or to any one of the undersigned agents at the ports, a certificate of his identity, signed by any mayor, magistrate, Justice of the peace, minister of religion, physician, surgeon, solicitor, or notary, resident in the United Kingdom. Every such certificate must bear the signature of the person in whose behalf it is granted, and when it is forwarded to the Foreign Office by post, it must, if it be required that the passport should be sent by return of post to the person who granted the certificate, be accompanied by a post-office order for the amount of the fee; or, if it be forwarded by post to an agent at an outport, the postage must be prepaid. But an agent at an outport will only deliver passports to persons applying for them there in pursuance of such certificate, but will not send them by post to any person whatever. The applications for the passport must be addressed "To the Chief Clerk of the Foreign Office, London," and should have the word "Passport" conspicuously written upon the cover. FRANCE.—Notice to British Subjects visiting France.—British Subjects are admitted into France upon the simple declaration of their nationality, without a Passport or other formality. Those of them, however, who intend to use the privilege (accorded to Foreigners provided with Passports) of admission to the **Public Establishments** in France should have their visiting Cards stamped, on arrival at either **Boulogne** or **Calais**, by the Agent of the French Government appointed there for the purpose, or procure a card conferring the same advantages, by application at the Prefecture of Police in Paris. The French *Visa* is not necessary for the Passports of **Belgian Travellers** provided with **Through Tickets**, in crossing the French Territory between Belgium and England, via Boulogne and Calais.

Belgium.—English visitors to Belgium must be provided with Passports; which are to be obtained in London. The *visa* for Belgium (not obligatory) to Foreign Office and all other Passports, can only be obtained at 33, Gracechurch Street; fee, 8s. 6d.

A Permit to embark is not required at Ostend.

Holland.—A Foreign Office Passport is necessary. The *visa* may be obtained at the Ambassador's, on giving a day's notice and leaving the Passport; or at the Consul's on application, on payment of a fee of 6s.

Prussia.—British subjects are now allowed to enter the Prussian dominions with a Foreign Office passport, without the countersignature of the Prussian Ambassador or Consul, but the *visa* of the Ambassadors or Consuls of each of the countries through which they may pass must be obtained.

Austria.—British subjects must be provided with a Foreign Office passport, countersigned by the Austrian Ambassador, and by the Ambassadors or Consuls of each of the countries through which they may pass. The Austrian *visa* may be obtained, gratis, between the hours of 12 and 3, at the Austrian Legation, 7, Chandos Street, Cavendish Square.

Italy.—Before entering the Papal States, the Passports of British subjects must be *visé* by the Papal Consul or Nuncio resident in the Capital, last visited by him. The Austrian *visa* is available for the Venetian States, and Lombardy. The Tuscan and Neapolitan should be obtained in London. In Passport Towns the *visa* of the British Consul is necessary. The Traveller, before quitting Rome on his return, should obtain the *visa* of the representatives of the various dominions through which he purposes to travel.

Sardinia.—Consulate, 31, Old Jewry. *Visa* to Foreign Office Passport not necessary.

*Issued by the Foreign Office Agent, F. M. Faulkner, Esq., at his Office, near the Pavilion Hotel, Folkestone. *Visas* can also be obtained at the French and other Consuls. The French Consul has an Office in the Waiting-room, and his attendance one hour before the steamer starts.

Foreign Office Passports can be prepared to be ready on the arrival of the Tidal Trains, on application being previously made to Mr. Faulkner, Folkestone, enclosing the fee of 2s.

FARES FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

TO OR FROM SOUTH EASTERN RAILWAY (LONDON BRIDGE STATION).

WITHIN A CIRCLE OF 4 MILES RADIUS FROM CHARIING CROSS, MEASURED BY AUTHORITY OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF POLICE.

NOTE.—L signifies London-bridge; S, Southwark-bridge; W, Waterloo-bridge; W, Westminster-bridge; V, Vauxhall-bridge.

FARES FOR ONE-HORSE CARRIAGES.

1.—BY DISTANCE.—For Two Persons, sixpence per mile, or part of a mile. If carriage discharged beyond four miles of Charing Cross, one shilling for every mile or part of a mile beyond such radius. No hack fare can be demanded. When a carriage is detained by the hire, a sum of sixpence for every complete fifteen minutes so detained (over and above the fare by distance), can be claimed.

2.—BY TIME.—For Two Persons, for any time not exceeding one hour, two shillings. For every fifteen minutes or part of fifteen minutes, after the first hour, sixpence. No hack fare can be demanded. Driver hired by time must drive at the rate of four miles per hour, but if required to drive faster, then a further sum of sixpence for every mile or part of a mile beyond four miles, done within the hour, must be paid.

3.—BY TIME OR DISTANCE.—Fares for more than Two Persons.—When more than two persons are carried, one sum of sixpence is to be paid for each person above the number of two, for the whole hiring (no matter what the time engaged or distance travelled), in addition to the fares by distance or time for two persons. Two children under ten years of age count as one adult.

4.—LUGGAGE.—If only two persons travel, no extra payment is allowed for a reasonable quantity of luggage, whether placed inside or outside; but if more than two persons travel inside, and more luggage is conveyed than can be carried inside, then twopence for each box or package carried outside.

5.—TICKETS.—Every driver is bound to deliver a ticket, bearing the number of the carriage, to hire.

6.—One mile is 1760 yards.
